CROP HUNGER WALK, SATURDAY OCTOBER 11 What is CROP? CROP is the hunger fighting effort organized by Church World Service in 1946, following WWII. CROP works to eradicate

the root causes of hunger and homelessness while remaining responsive to emergency situations, such as famine, flood and other natural disasters. Adams County will celebrate their 22nd year in supporting the CROP Hunger Walk and would like you to join us. Funds raised in a CROP Walk assist people in need around the world. For example, \$18 can provide emergency food supplies for a family of 5 for a week. \$40 can enable a woman to attend literacy class for a year and change her life forever. This year, for the first time, Good Shepherd's food bank will receive a portion of the money raised by the West Adams County Walk! Please see Bill or Linda Keck to volunteer to walk OR to support a walker. They have envelopes available for walkers. This is a wonderful family activity; dogs on leashes are also welcome!
