The Youth Group will serve you a FABULOUS 3 course lunch. Please come hungry. There will be different soup and chili options for everyone. All proceeds will go to help the kids and chaperons pay for their mission trip this summer.

MANY THANKS to all you generous folks at Good Shepherd! The special collection to cover school fees for children at the Heather Chimoga Care Center in Zimbabwe raised \$860 so far!! Combined with the \$500 matching grant this becomes \$1,360. This will cover fees for an entire year (3 terms) for at least 22 children. Donations will continue to be accepted.

ONCE AGAIN WE ARE PREPARING TO RECEIVE THE ANNUAL ONE GREAT HOUR OF SHARING OFFERING ON EASTER SUNDAY. As you know this is divided equally between:

- Presbyterian Disaster Assistance. In 2015 this agency was "ready to go" when disasters such as the 2 massive earthquakes in Nepal happened. PDA joined with other emergency assistance efforts to provide Ready to Eat food, family water treatment and personal hygiene kits, tarps for emergency shelter and basic survival items like kitchen utensils and blankets.

- Self-Development of People. In 2014 the SDP partnered with the Multicultural Alliance for a Safe Environment to clean up uranium tailings at abandoned mines in the Navaho Nation of New Mexico.

- Presbyterian Hunger Program. This agency has recently been working with a local agency in El Salvador to promote the use of native seeds, organic fertilizers and agro-ecological farming practices to combat the severe drought conditions that are ongoing in Central America.
