COMMUNITY OUTREACH COMMITTEE REPORT: The Outreach group continues to gather information. Our goal is for Good Shepherd to become a good neighbor and build a presence for Good Shepherd Church. When we met March 15th we learned much about **Victim Services** from Jaylynn Wayman, Coordinator with the Adams County Sheriff's Office. Jaylynn spoke extensively on what their team does and the many services they, with the help of volunteers, are able to provide. She explained a bit about the extensive training all volunteers go through so they are prepared for the work as much as possible. We will have Jaylynn give a Moment for Missions on April 17. Staff from the Sheriff's Office will be available during Fellowship hour after church to answer questions.

There are several ways Good Shepherd can help: Simple collections of stuffed animals; make emergency clean up kits (soap, washcloths, etc.) for use as families are displaced from their homes. Do a little fund raising. Give the Victim Services some of the benefits of our Food Bank.

Clothing drive. Hold meetings / community events in Shepherd's Hall. Become a volunteer in some way. Victim Services also reaches out to runaways and works with families in crises such as a death of the main wage earner, or a family that has suffered great loss in a fire.

Let us each broaden our thinking and watch for ways Good Shepherd can support our community. We really have a lot of kindness to offer.

THE MANY WAYS OF PARTNERSHIP IN THE PRESBYTERY -- In commemoration of the tenth anniversary of the Partnership of Zimbabwe and Denver Presbyteries, the three mission partnerships which connect with Zimbabwe-related concerns, Lomagundi Clinic, Zimbabwe and Zimbabwe KidZ, came together to fund a well in a Zimbabwean community of great need. Long without available water, the community of Eiffel Flats with two Presbyterian congregations, one a congregation of the Uniting Presbyterian Church in Southern Africa and the other formed by the Malawi-based CCAP, was selected by our Zimbabwean partners. Funding for the well came from a variety of sources: fundraising by the mission partnerships in our Presbytery, a generous gift from a donor outside the Presbytery and a grant from the Presbyterian Church's World Mission. The Eiffel Flats congregations developed covenants of responsibility and together with representatives from both denominations began the work of contracting with firms to do drilling. Soon, clean water will be flowing there. Three mission partnerships, twenty-two congregations in Zimbabwe and the U.S., three denominations, and two presbyteries partner together to bring water to this part of God's kingdom. *To God, we give thanks!*
