- experiencing the joy of watching the seasons unfold in blooms that begin in early spring with Aubrieta's intense plum colored blossoms and the dark pasque flower blooms, thru tulips and early short bright yellow iris, then blue medium tall, then purple tall iris, grape hyacinths, basket of gold,

Candytuft, Amsonia, snow in summer, delphinium/larkspur, creeping veronica, creeping thyme, cat mint, allium, wild geranium, columbine, primrose, peonies, roses, penstemons, day lilies, red hot poker, lavender, ice plants, garlic chives, horehound, sages, butterfly bushes, butterfly weed, sedums, green santolina, Mohave Sage, and ending the blooming season with the deep blue blossoms of plumbago,.

- having the fun and experiencing the challenge of successfully growing plants in Colorado and its various micro climates!
