WHAT'S WHAT WITH FINANCES As we come to the close of the first half of 2016, the Finance Work Group is grateful and happy. Thanks to your continuing support, we are in great shape. We have received 53% of our pledge budget and 65% of our projected contributions. Overall, our total operating budget revenue is at 57% of the proposed 2016 budget.. Revenue through June 2016 is \$99,438.97 with expenses at \$99,521.58. In addition to meeting budget needs, Good Shepherd has responded with support for various mission projects, Food Bank, special offerings and other outreach activities. With your support we will continue to work on our vision and place in our neighborhood. Thank you!
