**THE PRESBYTERY OF DENVER REACHES OUT TO NEW BELIEVERS WITH NEW MINISTRIES.** The resources of the Presbytery encourage and support varieties of new ministries. Worship in the Presbytery is held now in five different languages: English, Spanish, Korean, Vietnamese and Burmese. Even more language groups are starting to become part of the Presbytery’s ministry. In addition, five new worshiping communities offer worship and community to people who may have moved away from the church or have never experienced a church that can speak to their need and hope. Some are grounded in relationships built in neighborhoods; other ones are focused on a particular language group; and still others offer worship that addresses spiritual needs in new ways. The Presbytery also supports the visions, explorations and plans of existing congregations as they seek a new beginning and a new way of being and doing church. For example, ten congregations with the support of the Presbytery have completed or are part of the New Beginnings discernment process. Truly, it is an exciting day for the church and the Presbytery gives thanks for the opportunity to share in God’s mission in the world.
