"WE WALK BECAUSE THEY WALK". This is the motto of the annual CROP Hunger Walk, reminding us that millions of (mostly) women around the world spend much of every day walking long distances to get clean water for their family's basic needs. CROP is the hunger-fighting effort organized by Church World Service in 1946, following WWII. CROP works to eradicate the root causes of hunger and homelessness, while remaining responsive to emergency situations such as famine, flood and other natural disasters.

West Adams County will celebrate their 25th year in supporting the CROP Hunger Walk and would like you to join us on **Saturday, October 8th from 8am – noon.** Funds raised assist people around the world. For example, \$18 can provide emergency food supplies for a family of 5 for a week, \$40 can enable a woman to attend literacy class for a year and change her life forever. Again this year Good Shepherd's food bank will receive a portion of the money raised. This is a wonderful family activity; dogs on leashes are welcome. Walks of 1 mile, 5K, or 10K are offered. All will begin and end (with a free breakfast!) at Fellowship Hall. **To donate, talk to Mary McCarron to sign a pledge sheet.**
