OPENING THE DOORS ... TO NEW LEADERSHIP IN THE PRESBYTERY OF DENVER. At the Tuesday, January 24th Presbytery Assembly the Stated Clerk Search Committee reported and brought a recommendation that the Council nominate to the Presbytery, Ruling Elder Olivia Hudson Smith as our next Stated Clerk. Olivia was unanimously elected. Olivia has had a distinguished service to the Presbytery Moderator of the Presbytery and on the Committee on Ministry, the Committee on Preparation for Ministry, the Presbytery Council, and the Mission and Ministry and Leadership Work Groups. Currently, Olivia is chairperson of the Racial Ethnic Diversity Work Group. Along with her Presbytery experience Olivia also brings her experience as an attorney with the City and County in Denver and as a member and leader at Peoples Church. Olivia officially begins her service to the Presbytery on February 1st.
