He then brings them back to the Food Bank, checks temperatures of frozen or refrigerated items, records the weight of everything and then sends in a report to Food Bank of the Rockies. This usually takes about 2 hours each Monday morning from start to finish. Jim McCarron and Judy Ezzell are always here waiting for him and help him put everything away. He is looking for a person with a van or truck who could sub for him once in a while and he will be glad to train you!
