ITEMS NEEDED FOR THE FOOD BANK FOR FEBRUARY: Soups or chili and toilet paper. Please place items in the bench in the Narthex or bring to the Food Bank. During January the Food Bank gave out 124 orders to 99 households, serving 315 clients, including 114 children.

HELP NEEDED! John Shaeffer picks up for the Food Bank from the Wal Mart Neighborhood Market at 10755 Washington in Northglenn each Monday morning at 8:30 a.m. and usually receives 10-15 large boxes of assorted groceries...meat, bread, and assorted miscellaneous items. He then brings them back to the Food Bank, checks temperatures of frozen or refrigerated items, records the weight of everything and then sends in a report to Food Bank of the Rockies. This usually takes about 2 hours each Monday morning from start to finish. Jim McCarron and Judy Ezzell are always here waiting for him and help him put everything away. He is looking for a person with a van or truck who could sub for him once in a while and he will be glad to train you!
